URINARY TRACT INFECTIONS The diagnosis of urinary tract infection (UTI) is primarily based on symptoms and signs Typical symptoms or signs of lower urinary tract infections (cystitis) include dysuria, urinary frequency, urgency, haematuria and suprapubic tenderness but no fever
